

Should you withdraw your child from the school, you will be charged for the uniform as follows:

- Withdrawing after spending 1 term or less at school, you will be charged AED 1,000/-
- Withdrawing after spending 1 to 2 terms at school, you will be charged AED 500/-
- Withdrawing after spending 2 to 3 terms at school, you will not be charged for the uniform

UNIFORM POLICY





SCHOOL SHOES:

Parents are required to purchase school shoes for daily wear, based on the following guidelines:

GIRLS	BOYS
Black Shoes: Flat (no heel), lace up or velcro fastening. Girls from Year 1 up are allowed to wear black slip-on shoes (ballet pump) but the heel must be flat. Sports shoes may not be worn.	Black shoes: Flat (no heel), lace up or velcro fastening. Sports shoes may not be worn.

Please Note: Velcro may be easier than laces for young children.

SOCKS	White or Dark (Blue, Grey, Black) ankle socks (no stripes). White ankle socks for sports.

SCHOOL BAG:

- School bags may be back-pack style only. No trolley bags.
- Parents should note that children will only be carrying:
 - » A small number of books
 - » PE kit bag (on specific days only)
 - » iPad (Year 3 and up)
 - » Lunch (if not purchased at the canteen)

It is completely up to the parents to decide if a school bag is necessary or not.

 - » Term 1: 4 sets of uniform are provided initially
 - » Term 2: 3 sets of uniform are provided initially
 - » Term 3: 2 sets of uniform are provided initially

UNIFORM POLICY

GENERAL UNIFORM INFORMATION

RECOMMENDED:

Parents are strongly encouraged to ensure their child brings a hat to school every day. This is for health and safety reasons, when children are playing or involved in PE/sports outside. Parents should ensure all uniform items are named.

JEWELLERY AND HEADWEAR:


- For health and safety reasons, pupils may only wear small studs and small watches.
- Headwear is only to be worn inside for religious or medical reasons.

REQUIRED:

- The school tie must be worn from Year 3 to Year 8 as part of the full school uniform.
- Children must wear the full school uniform every day and will be politely and discretely reminded if they are not.
- Plain, black shoes (as per guidelines above) will be worn as part of the daily school uniform and appropriate trainers are to be worn for PE and sports.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT - CODE OF CONDUCT

PUPIL CODE OF CONDUCT ON THE SCHOOL BUS

Pupils are expected to adhere to the below mentioned Code Of Conduct.

Let us work together to keep them safe and happy, while coming to and going home from school. Parents discussing these expectations with their child at home will be very helpful.

ARCADIA

PUPILS MUST:

- Be kind, be safe, be respectful at all times.
- Get the ID card scanned while boarding and de-boarding the bus.
- Treat the school Bus Attendant and Driver with the same respect as you would your teachers.
- Remain seated on the designated seat and wear your seatbelts, throughout the bus journey.
- Pupils aged 4 and below will be required to sit on the designated car/booster seatson the bus.
- Sit facing forward in your seats at all times.
- Keep the aisles and walkway clear at all times.
- Report problems, if any, to the Bus Attendant and/or Bus Driver.
- Only travel on your designated bus. If a temporary change is required, parents must inform the school at least 24 hours in advance.
- Be ready and on time for departure and pick-up.
- Speak quietly with 'inside voices' throughout the bus journey.
- Wait for the sign from the Bus Attendant to leave or enter the bus.

PUPILS MUST NOT:

- Throw objects of any kind on the bus.
- Shout or be unkind verbally and/or physically towards others.
- Damage the bus in any way (drawing on or putting feet up on the seats).
- Bring friends onto the bus without written permission from the school.
- Place anything outside the windows of the bus at any time.
- Eat or drink on the bus.

MEDIA CONSENT

PARENTAL CONSENT FOR USE OF VIDEO OR PHOTOGRAPHIC IMAGES





As part of the day-to-day operation of our school, we regularly take photographs (and occasionally), video of our pupils.

We use these images:

- To share a child's learning with parents through our online learning portfolio software (Seesaw).
- As part of our school displays.
- Within printed publications such as the school newsletter and school prospectus.
- On our school website and social media platforms, promoting the school.
- Within school approved external publications and websites.

If we use photographs of individual pupils, we will not use the name of that child in the accompanying text or photo caption. If we name a pupil in the text, we will not use a photograph of that child to accompany the article (unless a child has won an award and the parent would like the name of their child to accompany the picture; in which case, we will obtain permission from the parent before using the image and naming the child). Name badges or other distinguishing information appearing on any photograph will be removed prior to publishing.

From time to time, our school may be visited by the media, who will take photographs or video footage of high profile events. Children may appear in these images, which will sometimes be published in local or national newspapers, or on websites approved by the school. We may also make our own video recordings of school events and learning, and may use this within our own website and social media or on approved websites.

We therefore seek your permission to photograph or make recordings of your child. Please read the Conditions of Use below, sign and date the form where indicated and return the completed form to the school.

CONDITIONS OF USE

- This form is valid for the time that your child is enrolled at the Arcadia School from the date you sign it.
- The consent will automatically expire a year after your child has left this school. We will not re-use any photographs or recordings a year after your child leaves this school.
- We will not use the personal details or full names (which means first name and surname) of any child or adult in a photographic image, on video, on our website, in our school prospectus or in any of our other printed publications.
- We will not include personal e-mail or postal addresses, or telephone numbers on video, on our website, in our school prospectus or in other printed publications.
- If we use photographs of individual pupils, we will not use the name of that child in the accompanying text or photo caption. If we name a pupil in the text, we will not use a photograph of that child to accompany the article (apart from when specific approval has been sought and received from the parents concerned).
- We may include pictures of pupils and teachers that have been drawn by pupils.
- We may use group or class photographs or footage with very general labels, such as 'a science lesson' or 'making Eid decorations'.
